

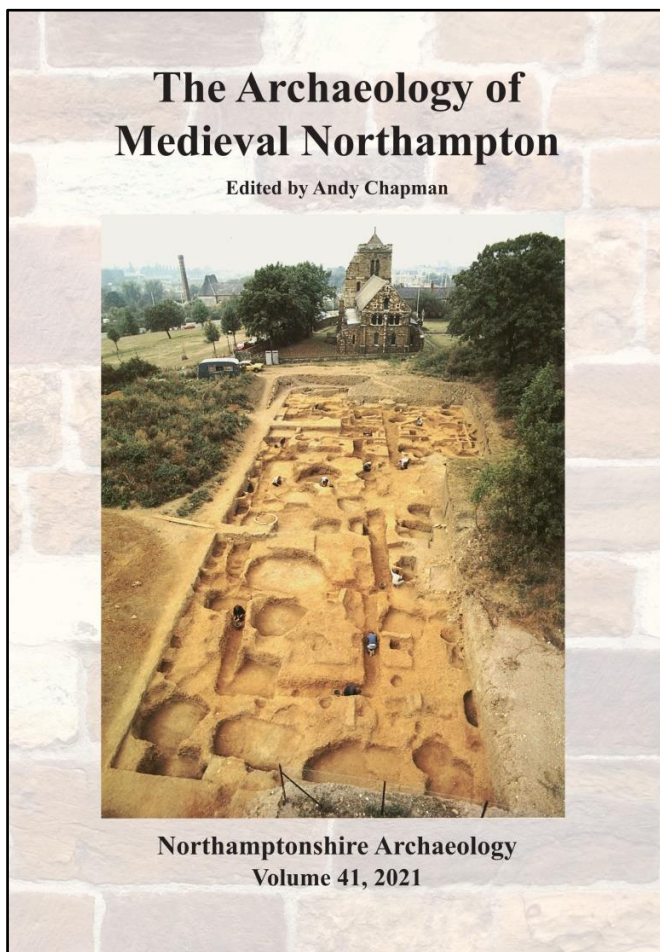

Edited by Andy Chapman, this volume contains a series of articles that examine: the archaeology of the pre-Conquest town, including the Anglo-Saxon 'Palaces' east of St Peter's Church; Part 1 of an overview of the history and archaeology of Northampton Castle, with separate articles examining the pre-castle and castle archaeology uncovered in 2013 on the site of the new rail station; a major study of the location of the medieval Jewry and synagogue; shorter articles and notes on aspects of the archaeology of both the town and the broader county, along with book reviews and a roundup of archaeological work in the county 2018-20.
