During December 1976 and January 1977 the County Council, with the support of the DoE, appointed two Archaeological Assistants; in December, Glenn Foard, as Sites and Monuments Assistant, continuing the building up of the archaeological sites index.

In January, Lynn Dyson-Bruce, Post-Excavation Assistant, began a review of the backlog of unpublished excavations in Northemptonshire.
