The tour guide was Hugh Richmond who gave us a memorable and enthralling tour of the three churches. Of particular note were the fine Late Medieval wall paintings in Raunds church and the "sound holes" in Denford church which were presumably used for improving the acoustics in the chancel by filling small voids in the chancel wall with complete Medieval pots. Unfortunately only one complete pot survived. Nevertheless, it was an interesting and entertaining evening.
