NORTHAMPTONSHIRE'S HERITAGE UPDATE

At Northampton Museum

Sadly, at Daventry the District Council's Moot House Museum's lottery project has been formally abandoned. After last year securing funding amounting to £355,000 from the Heritage Lottery Fund, work was to have started shortly on museum display and educational developments, including provision of a disabled access lift. Despite much local lobbying, Daventry District Council decided in March against contributing their share, amounting to £120,000 (plus some lesser additional costs) and the project has thus had to be abandoned. A follow-up proposal to relocate the Museum to smaller premises has thankfully been dropped though further re-organisation and loss of resources at the Museum can not be ruled out.

And from Northamptonshire County Council's Historic Environment Team comes the news that member Glenn Foard, County Archaeological Officer, left in April to take up a new post with The Battlefield Trust. NAS wish him well in his new role and hope that the Society and others in Northamptonshire can continue to benefit from his unrivalled fund of local knowledge and archaeological expertise. It is to be hoped that the County Council will refill the County Archaeological Officer post as soon as possible.

Better news from the Northamptonshire Finds Liaison Officer's post, part of the Portable Antiquities scheme. DCMS (Department for Culture, Media & Sports) has agreed to fund the post for another year. This will allow the HLF more time to consider the bid before them for a 3 year extension of existing posts and expansion of the Scheme to a national basis. Rhiannon Harte, Finds Liaison Officer for Northamptonshire is continuing to provide a free finds identification and recording service to metal detectorists and members of the public.
